INVESTOR PROFILE

The Ultra Aggressive portfolio is for high-risk tolerance investors seeking to maximize returns and capital gains through an aggressive investment approach.

METHODOLOGY

The Ultra Aggressive portfolio trades exchange-traded funds (ETFs), relying on high-risk, high-reward asset classes. The portfolio is designed for investors who have a long-term investment horizon in order to sustain possible market fluctuations, while seeking income and growth. Holdings rotate among various asset classes based on perceived opportunities for better returns indicated by Howard Capital Management Inc.'s (HCM) Proactive Sector Rotation methodology.

INVESTOR REQUIREMENTS

This portfolio requires a \$500K minimum, or \$500K accumulative per client household with HCM.

The Ultra Aggressive strategy typically seeks to participate in all equity markets and sectors by investing the portfolio in sectors which HCM's Proactive Section Rotation (PSR) methodology indicates to have the potential to meet performance objectives. PSR is a tactical asset allocation methodology, which attempts to identify the best performing sectors at a given point in time. The Ultra Aggressive strategy utilizes the HCM-BuyLine® proprietary indicator to monitor market conditions and assist in determining whether or not assets should be invested in equity products or moved to cash or cash equivalents. Multiple indicators are monitored in an effort to identify such trends in the equity markets. The strategy is rebalanced periodically, and it is possible for the allocation to be adjusted, including when the HCM-BuyLine® indicates a strengthening or weakening of the equity markets. Because this Howard Capital Management, Inc. (HCM) strategy is actively managed, it may experience above-average turnover, which could have a negative impact on account performance. To discourage short-term investing and excessive trading, mutual funds, including those utilized in the Ultra Aggressive strategy, may impose short-term redemption fees that range from 0.50% to 2.00%. HCM seeks to avoid these fees, but they may occasionally be incurred. This model requires a minimum account size of \$500,000.

Comparative Benchmark. S&P 500 Monthly Reinvested Index (20%), HFRX Equity Hedge Index (80%). S&P 500 Reinvested is a gauge of the large cap U.S. equities market.
